

Dr. Blind Jean-Paul Fouchécourt Tenor

Combining sensibility, elegance of singing, and diction mixed with a strong stage presence, Jean-Paul Fouchécourt has gained an international reputation by his portraits of the title role in Platée, Arnalta (L'incoronazione di Poppea), and so-called 'character' roles such as les quatre valets (Les contes d'Hoffmann), Ouf 1er (L'étoile), Teapot/Little Old Man/Frog (L'enfant et les sortilèges), and Torquemada (L'heure espagnole).

In 1987, he worked with William Christie in the ensemble Les Arts Florissants and participated in the historic recreation of Lully's Atys at the Opéra Comique, which triggered the craze for French baroque music. He debuted in 1993 at the Amsterdam Opera in L'incoronazione di Poppea.

In 1996, Mr. Fouchécourt marked his international debut as Husband in Les mamelles de Tirésias at the Saito Kinen Festival Matsumoto, followed by engagements at Royal Opera House, Metropolitan Opera, New York City Opera, Teatro alla Scala, Opera Bastille, as well as in the festivals of Aix-en-Provence, Salzburg, and Proms. He has performed with Boston Symphony Orchestra, Orchestre National de France, Vienna Philharmonic, BBC Symphony, Rotterdam Philharmonic, under conductors including Charles Dutoit, Sir John Eliot Gardiner, Valery Gergiev, Yannick Nézet-Séguin, James Levine, Antonio Pappano, and Sir Simon Rattle.

Mr. Fouchécourt has given recitals at Florence Gould Hall, Carnegie Hall, Wigmore Hall, among others, with pianists including Dalton Baldwin, Graham Johnson, Jeff Cohen, Christian Ivaldi, Jean-Marc Luisada, Susan Manoff, Roger Muraro, Alain Planès, Alexandre Tharaud, and Jean-Claude Pennetier. In 2015, he created Menu: Plaisirs with pianist Jamal Moqadem and director Jean Lacornerie at the Théâtre de la Croix-Rousse and toured France, New York, and Washington, DC.

He is now passing on his experience to the younger generation and has been artistic director of the Studio de l'Opéra de Lyon since 2011. He is a Knight in the National Order of Merit.
