

Alfred John Tessier Tenor

On the international stages of opera, concert, and recital, Canadian John Tessier garners praise and attention for the beauty and honesty of his voice, for a refined style and creative versatility, and for his handsome presence in the lyric tenor repertoire.

In the 2019/20 season, he appears with Duain Wolfe and the Colorado Symphony, *Krzysztof Urbański* and the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, with Rune Bergmann and the Calgary Philharmonic in Beethoven's Missa Solemnis, with Leslie Dala and the Vancouver Bach Choir in Handel's Messiah, and with Jun Märkl and the Dallas Symphony in Berlioz's Roméo et Juliette.

Highlights of past seasons include II barbiere di Siviglia, La fille du régiment, and I puritani at Wiener Staatsoper, *Médée at* Théâtre des Champs Élysées, Les pêcheurs de perles and Maria Stuarda at Seattle Opera, The Elixir of Love at English National Opera and New York City Opera, and *a role debut as Werther at Manitoba Opera*. Mr. Tessier gave the world premiere of Robin de Raaff's *Waiting for Miss Monroe* with Dutch National Opera, has sung *Der fliegende Holländer* at the Royal Opera House, and Don Giovanni for a South American debut at the Teatro Colón.

On the concert stage, the tenor has been heard in performances of Bach's St Matthew Passion with Orchestra of St. Luke's (Iván Fischer) at Carnegie Hall, Rossini's Stabat Mater and Schumann's *Scenes from Goethe's Faust* with the Cleveland Orchestra (Franz Welser-Möst), Mozart's Requiem with the Montreal Symphony Orchestra (Hervé Niquet), Carmina Burana with the Baltimore Symphony (Marin Alsop), among others.

Mr. Tessier's discography includes Mozart's Requiem both with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (Donald Runnicles) and Les Violons du Roy (Bernard Labadie), John Corigliano's A Dylan Thomas Trilogy with the Nashville Symphony (Leonard Slatkin), and Leonard Bernstein's A Quiet Place with the Montreal Symphony Orchestra (Kent Nagano)
